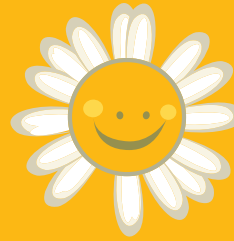


# Volunteer Role: Occasional Fundraising Volunteer

## Background

Cancer Fund for Children is the leading voluntary organisation working with children, teenagers and young adults living with cancer and their families in Northern Ireland. It cost £2.4m to run Cancer Fund for Children in 2018. We receive less than 0.5% of our funding from the government so we rely on donations and the generosity of our supporters to help raise these essential funds.

## What is the purpose of the role?

Occasional Fundraising Volunteers would assist in collecting money at events, bag packs, street collections, and giving a helping hand; for example assisting in setting up a stand.
